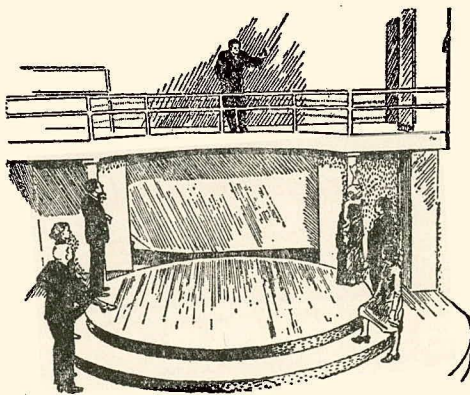

INTRODUCTION

As a sequel to *Bibliography of Group Psychotherapy 1906-1956* by R. J. Corsini and L. J. Putzey this bibliography retains the same format and abbreviations. A careful search of major abstracting sources (Psychological Abstracts, Cumulative Medical Index, Dissertation Abstracts), the *Annual Review of Psychology*, books, and the Table of Contents of journals listed on the following page was made for writings on group psychotherapy during the period 1956 through 1962. In this manner 1330 items were located for the seven-year period of this bibliography.

Abbreviations

Abbreviations used in the previous bibliography are continued: GP = Group Psychotherapy, GT = Group Therapy, PD = Psychodrama, and the list of special abbreviations of Journal titles on the following page.

Additions and Corrections

We have attempted to be as accurate and complete as possible but the fact that publication in the area of group psychotherapy takes place in a wide variety of journals makes omission and error a possibility. INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL OF GROUP PSYCHOTHERAPY

The International Council of Group Psychotherapy is about to release the International Handbook of Group Psychotherapy, the closing step of the Third International Congress of Group Psychotherapy in Milan, 1963. Its two next objectives are: 1) writing a Constitution for the International Association of Group Psychotherapy (which, however, may be called the World Federation of Group Psychotherapy), and 2) to organize an International Board of Standards in order to establish the categories of minimum standards of group psychotherapists. Such a Board of Standards may be recognized eventually as an International Board of Group Psychotherapy which will be then subdivided into national boards of group psychotherapy, which will issue credentials of Diplomates in the field of group psychotherapy. Although the International Board will set up standards in a broad sense of the word, the national boards will modify them to fit the special conditions in a particular country or culture.

A Constitution is now being prepared as well as a set of standards. Members of the International Committee are herewith urgently requested to send their comments and suggestions in to P.O. Box 311, Beacon, N.Y.

Requirements for Diplomates of the International Board would be: a) membership in a recognized society of group psychotherapy in a given country, for instance, U.S.A., Canada, France, Germany, Argentina, Japan, etc. b) attainment of an academic degree in a recognized college or university which gives introductory courses in sociology, psychiatry and group psychotherapy; c) a certificate of training from a recognized Training Academy, the branches of the Moreno Academy in various countries or from Academies of similar standing.

WORLD CENTER OF PSYCHODRAMA, SOCIOMETRY AND GROUP PSYCHOTHERAPY

The Office of Recorder of Deeds, Corporation Division, Washington, D.C., has issued a Certificate that all provisions of the District of Columbia *Non-profit* Corporation Act have been complied with and accordingly this Certificate of Incorporation is hereby issued to the MORENO ACADEMY, WORLD CENTER OF PSYCHODRAMA, GROUP PSYCHOTHERAPY AND SOCIOMETRY, INC., June 3, 1964.

Objectives: 1. To promote and stimulate interest and knowledge of these sciences among both professionals and laymen on an international scale. 2. To coordinate research and training. 3. To serve as a central source of information and assistance.

Program: 1. To establish branches throughout the world, each operating under a Director certified by the World Center. Branches will have full autonomy to teach, train, and direct, and to hold workshops and conferences. 2. To make tuition-free scholarships available to as many qualified candidates as possible. 3. To organize and sponsor International Congresses of Psychodrama, Group Psychotherapy, and Sociometry annually or biennially. 4. Its most important objective is the training of highly qualified workers in the field. According to their qualifications and achievements they will receive *certificates* as to their competence as trainees and trainers. The certification from the recognized training institutes of the Moreno Academy here and abroad are one of the indispensable bases for the application for a diploma from a future International Board of Group Psychotherapy and Psychodrama. 5. The World Center has a number of recognized affiliate branches: at the Moreno Institute in New York City, at St. Elizabeths Hospital in Washington, D.C., at St. Louis State Hospital, St. Louis, Missouri, at the Psychodrama Center in Buenos Aires, South America, and at the Sociometry, Group Dynamics and Psychodrama Center in Paris, France.

Membership and Dues: The World Center offers three classes of professional membership and three classes of general membership. 1. Consultant—No fee. Recognized authorities in the Center's areas of interest or related fields. Nomination and election by the Board of Directors. 2. Fellow—\$100 Annually. Certified Directors of Psychodrama, Group Psychotherapy, and Sociometry. 3. Associate Fellow—\$50 Annually. Individuals with training and experience in these sciences. 4. Founder—Contributors of \$10,000 or more. 5. Sponsor-Contributors of

\$100 or more annually. Contributor—\$10.00 or more annually. All of these categories of membership include a subscription to either the journal, *Group Psychotherapy*, or the *International Journal of Sociometry and Sociatry*.

The Need for Funds: The most urgent need is for more trained directors of psychodrama, group psychotherapy and sociometry. We cannot begin to meet the demand for scholarships from highly qualified candidates and a million dollars could easily be used for this purpose alone.

Numerous research projects await only adequate financing. Centers for practicing psychodrama, group psychotherapy and sociometry are needed and desired by many areas in America and elsewhere. International Psychodrama, Group Psychotherapy, and Sociometry Congresses may be held at least every two years and preferably every year. The list of essential items for which money is needed is far too long to discuss in depth here. Your enquiries are invited as are your contributions. In order for a chapter to use the name of the Society and to assure its tax free status, all members of a chapter must also be members of the National Society. This membership may be accomplished in one of two ways: 1) those eligible may join; 2) those not eligible automatically become affiliate members through their chapter membership. Affiliate members have no vote and cannot hold office, and one dollar of their dues will be forwarded to the National organization.

The establishment of an American Board of Certification for Psychodramatists and Group Psychotherapists was discussed.

Dr. Moreno announced that the Moreno Fund awards for outstanding contributions to the Society went to:
